The first Sunday of each month, the youth of Wesley Park go to serve at Kids' Food Basket after worship. They make thousands of sandwiches for children in the community who need a healthy meal. Ask one of the youth what it feels like to do something to help alleviate childhood hunger.

Kids' Food Basket is a nonprofit organization attacking childhood hunger to help young people learn and live well. We began over a decade ago by serving 125 kids each school day through our Sack Supper program and now serve nearly 7,000 kids each weekday in West Michigan. Sack Suppers are evening meals that provide a well-rounded nutritious meal – nutrition that's critical to the development of kids' brains and bodies.

Please welcome Michelle Covington today, who has come from **Kids' Food Basket** to share the message in worship. (And wish her a Happy Birthday!) Hunger and Poverty have a devastating effect on the lives and development of children. You may be surprised to know the numbers of children in our area schools who live below the poverty line, or who suffer from poor nutrition.
