Dear friends, the Judicial Council of The United Methodist Church is much like our Supreme Court. It makes rulings based on the law as contained in the United Methodist Book of Discipline, focusing on the details of a particular case. Last week, the Judicial Council ruled that the election of Bishop Karen Oliveto of the Western Jurisdiction violates church law because of our current limit on the service of "self-avowed, practicing homosexuals." Bishop Oliveto is in a legal same-sex marriage. The ruling added that Bishop Oliveto remains in good standing as a bishop. Additional administrative proceedings will follow.

The United Methodist Church has begun a process, authorized by the General Conference, called the Commission on a Way Forward. United Methodists from around the world, spanning the theological spectrum, are gathering to consider creative and new ways of being the church. They will be considering every part of the Book of Discipline that addresses human sexuality. A special General Conference has been set for February 23-26, 2019 where this way forward will be considered. Bishop Bard of the Michigan area is encouraging on-going conversation, and will be "convening gatherings in the fall to discuss possibilities for unity in light of deeply held yet differing convictions about the nature of revelation, the love of God, and the appropriateness of same-sex attraction." Our Bishop encourages us to pray, and to enter into these conversations.

The Book of Discipline does affirm that all people are of sacred worth, and that it is our duty to invite all peoples to be disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. I hope and pray we will find a way forward so that we can focus on our mission, to build a Christian community with all people, and to make disciples of Christ for the transformation of the world. Let us always remember the radical love of Jesus Christ and the powerful movement of the Holy Spirit, bringing life from death, hope from despair, and a future for all creation.
