Today is World Communion Sunday, which started in 1940 as an interdenominational event.

What is World Communion Sunday?

World Communion Sunday is one of six churchwide Special Sundays with offerings of The United Methodist Church. World Communication Sunday calls the church to reach out to all people and model diversity among God's children. The special offering provides scholarships for U.S. (racial- and ethnic-minority) and international students. Students who receive scholarships study in a wide variety of fields: family pastoral care, Christian-Muslim relations, clinical psychology, peace and governance, crop production, law, health, rural development and more.

When do we celebrate World Communion Sunday?

United Methodists celebrate World Communion Sunday on the first Sunday in October.

How does The United Methodist Church distribute the offerings received on World Communion Sunday?

The treasurer of the General Council on Finance and Administration distributes net receipts, after payment of promotional expenses, to the administering agencies:

- World Communion Scholarships: 50 percent (General Board of Global Ministries), with at least one-half of the annual amount for ministries beyond the United States
- Ethnic Scholarship Program: 35 percent (General Board of Higher Education and Ministry)
- Ethnic In-Service Training Program: 15 percent (General Board of Higher Education and Ministry)

Thank you for supporting World Communion Sunday, and for keeping world peace in your heart as we share in the bread and cup of Holy Communion this day.
